

Assistant Professor in Pharmacoepidemiologic Methods (Tenure Track, 1.0 FTE)

Functie

The position involves 30% teaching activities and 70% research time. The core tasks will include:

- coordinating and teaching Pharmacoepidemiology related courses in the programmes of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Drug Innovation and the Pharmacoepidemiology Summer Programme;
- carrying out and supervising research (PhD and MSc) within the scope of the research programme;
- contributing to the acquisition of substantial external research funding for the benefit of the research programme;
- a strong contribution from the candidate to (maintaining) cooperation with (inter)national partners in the field of Pharmacoepidemiology.

Profiel

We are looking for someone who:

- holds a PhD degree in (Bio)Medical, (Bio)Statistical or Pharmaceutical Science or other relevant research field;
- has a strong research track record in methodological development/evaluation in observational drug research;
- has experience in coordinating research projects and/or international research collaborations;
- has scientific creativity and productivity, as evident in recent publications in (international) peer-reviewed journals;
- has the ability - and preferably experience with - to acquire research funding;
- has experience in teaching and/or co-coordinating academic courses;
- has experience in supervising MSc - and preferably PhD - students;
- holds a Basic Teaching Qualification (BKO) or is willing to acquire this qualification in the near future;
- is fluent in English;

- is effective and efficient, able to work within international/multidisciplinary teams and think conceptually;
- has good communication skills.

Aanbod

The candidate is offered a full-time position for five years. The gross salary varies, depending on previous qualifications and experience, between €3,427 and €5,330 (scale 11/12 Collective Labour Agreement Dutch Universities) gross per month for a full-time employment. The salary is supplemented with a holiday bonus of 8% and an end-of-year bonus of 8,3% per year. In addition we offer: a pension scheme, a partially paid parental leave, flexible employment conditions.

Conditions are based on the Collective Labour Agreement Dutch Universities. The research group will provide the candidate with necessary support on all aspects of the project. More information is available on the website.

Every year around 400 peer-reviewed articles are published and around 30 PhD candidates defend their thesis. UIPS is partner in several open source innovation networks.

As an Assistant Professor of Pharmacoepidemiologic Methods you will be employed in the Division of Pharmacoepidemiology and Clinical Pharmacology, Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences of the Faculty of Science, Utrecht University. The Division of Pharmacoepidemiology & Clinical Pharmacology consists of a multidisciplinary team internationally oriented researchers. The research programme is directed at several epidemiological, therapeutic, and policy aspects of chronic drug use with a focus on advanced affordable biomolecular and cellular therapies. The Centre for Research Methods is embedded in the Division. Its mission is to develop, improve and evaluate innovative pharmacoepidemiologic methods. Main focus of the centre is on methods to control for confounding in causal drug research, health technology assessment, precision medicine and increasing the validity and richness of data on drug exposure, disease outcomes, confounding (e.g. comorbidity, risk factors) and modifying (e.g. biomarkers) factors. The main focus of the current position will be on development and evaluation of pharmacoepidemiologic methods with the overall aim to obtain reliable information on benefits and harms of medicines after marketing.
